**I**nternational Perspectives: The Future of Nonhuman Primate Resources" is a workshop hosted by the Institute for Laboratory Animal Research (ILAR) at the National Academies. The goals of this workshop are: 1) to determine the best international strategies and practices for providing nonhuman primates needed for biomedical research while ensuring appropriate conservation practices; 2) to define genetic and microbiologic concerns and appropriate management practices; and 3) to identify mechanisms for facilitating the humane transportation of nonhuman primates internationally. Participants will discuss these issues with the goal of resolving them to the satisfaction of the regulators of these animals, the veterinary community responsible for their health and well-being, the agencies that provide funding for procurement and breeding of animals for research, and the investigators conducting the research.

The conference format will be interactive, focusing on sharing information and conducting detailed discussions. Formal presentations will be brief to allow ample time in each session for a panel discussion. Presentations from representative countries will reflect situations particular to those countries to provide a basis for discussions about harmonizing protocols.
